Finally, after a week, the parrot said: 'OK, I give up. Where's the boat?'

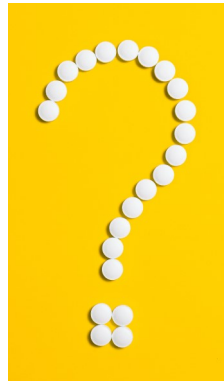

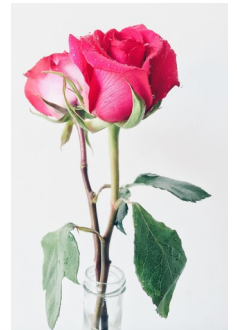
